At Least 24 Countries Affected by Cluster Munitions

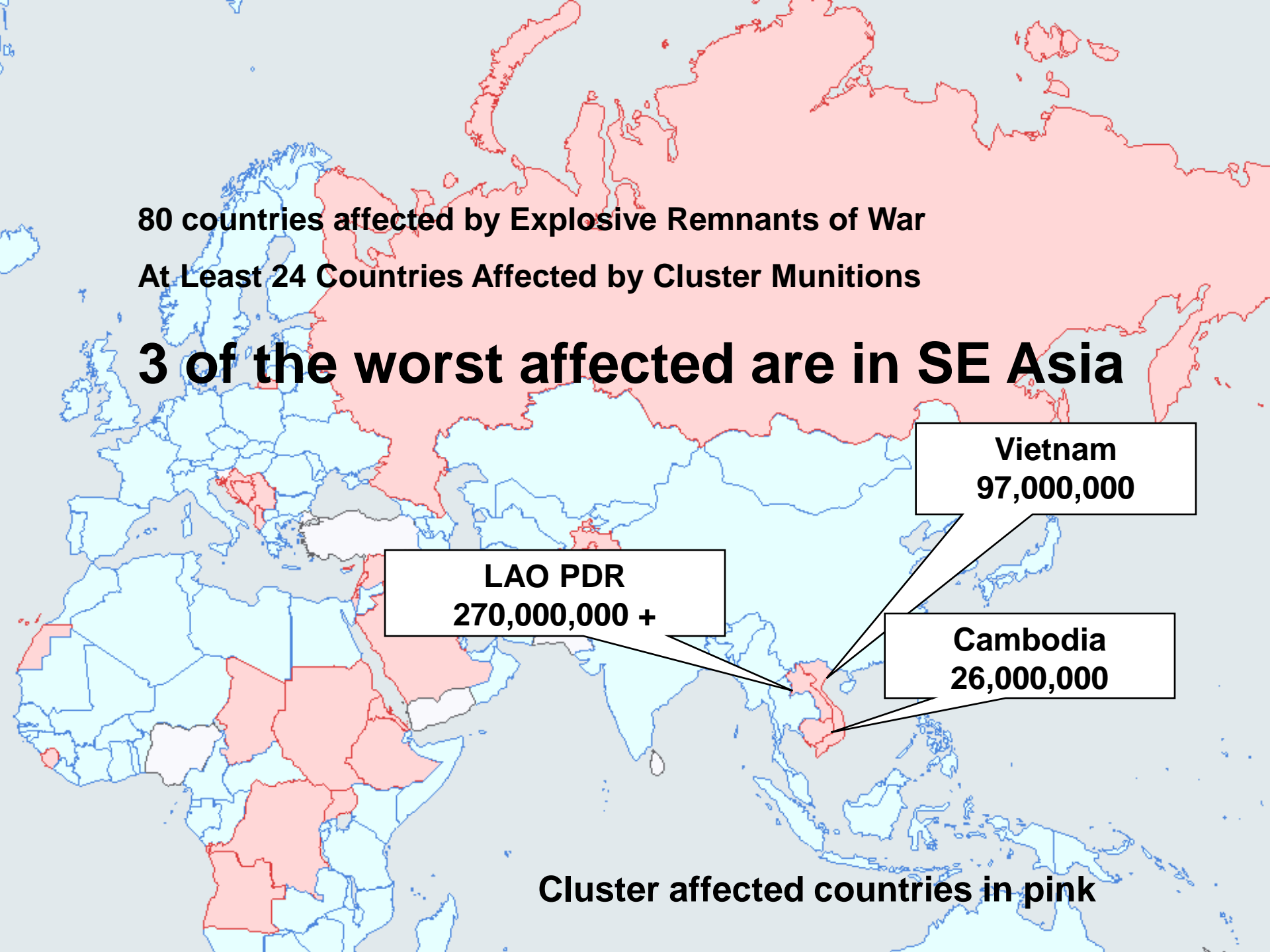

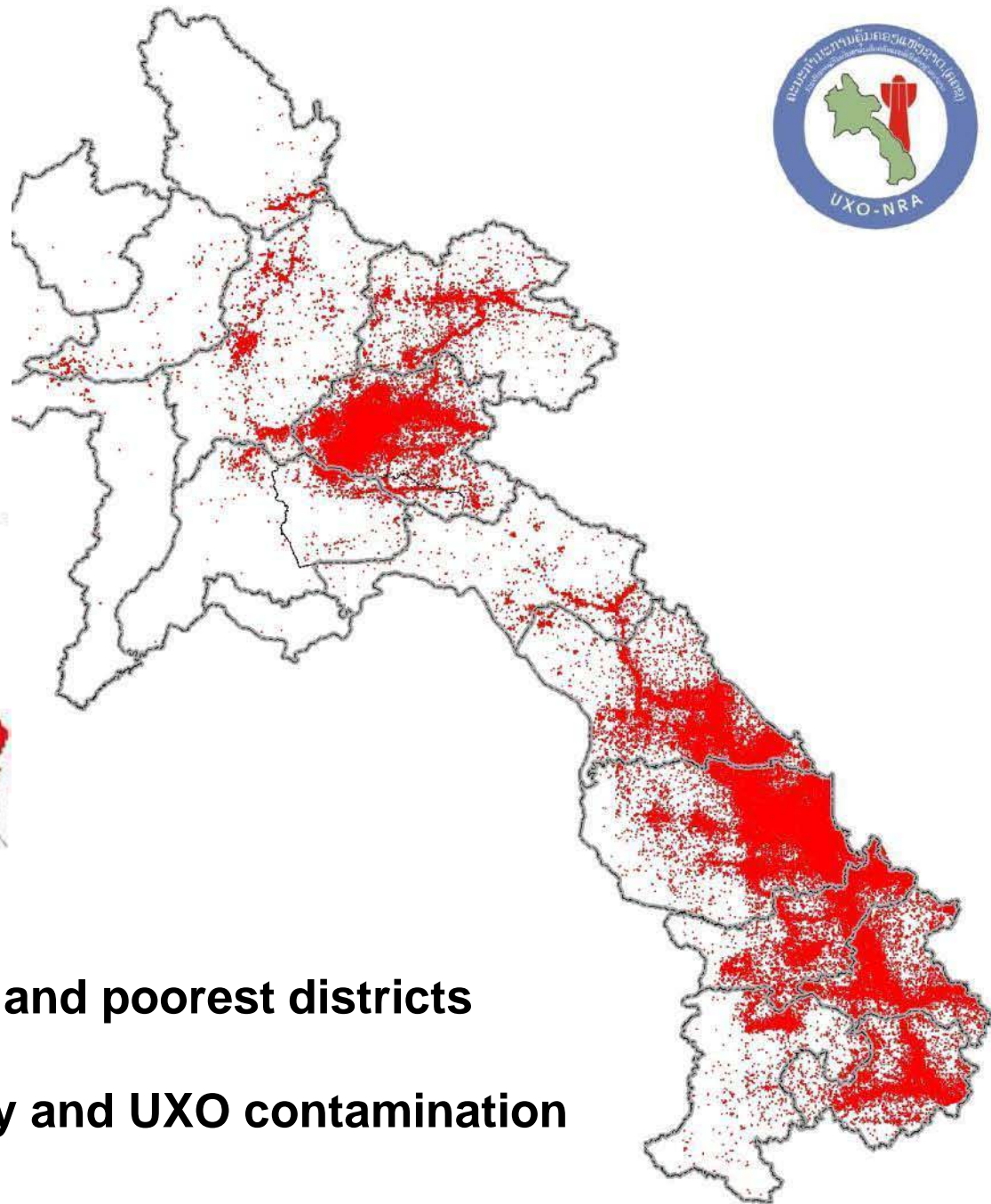
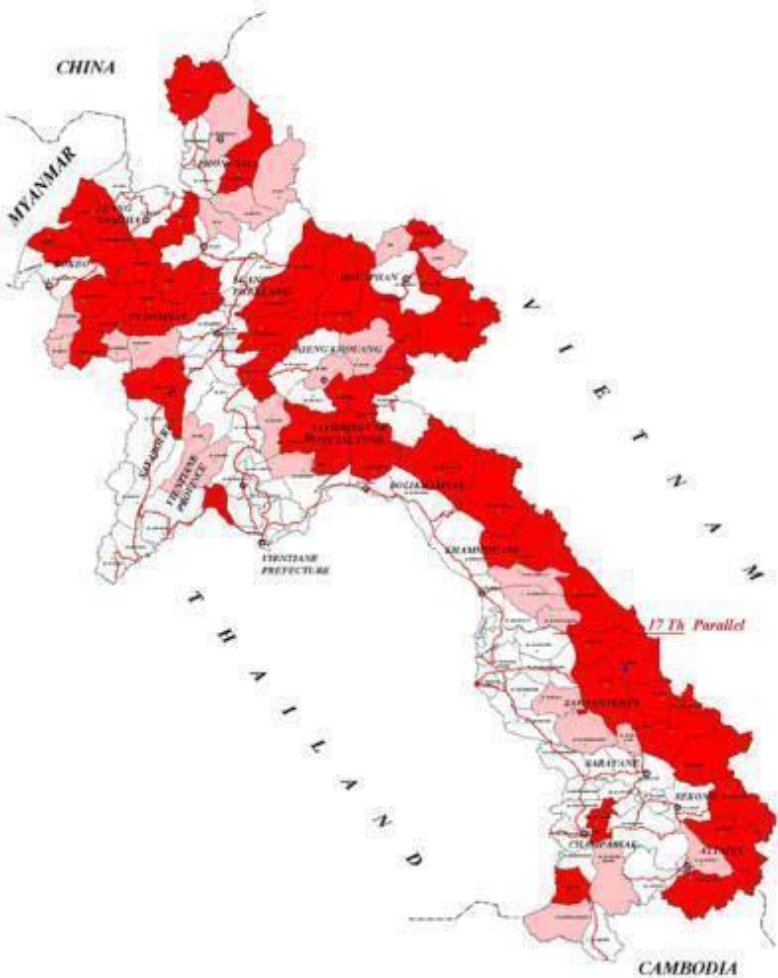




Background

Addressing UXO Issues

- **1995: Trust Fund for UXO Clearance established.**
- **1996: National UXO Programme (UXO Lao) established.**
- **2004: Adoption of the National Strategic Plan for the UXO Sector 2003-2013, “The Safe Path Forward”. (Being reviewed and to adopt a new strategic plan for 2010-2020 soon)**
- **2006: National Regulatory for the UXO Sector (NRA)**
- **Three pillars :**
 - **Making land safe (Clearance),**
 - **Teaching about the Risks (Mine Risk Education)**
 - **working with survivors (victim assistance)**

Clearance Progress (1996-2009)

Combined land clearance

- 25,061 hectares cleared
- 1,093,114 UXO destroyed (incl. 472,587 cluster submunitions)

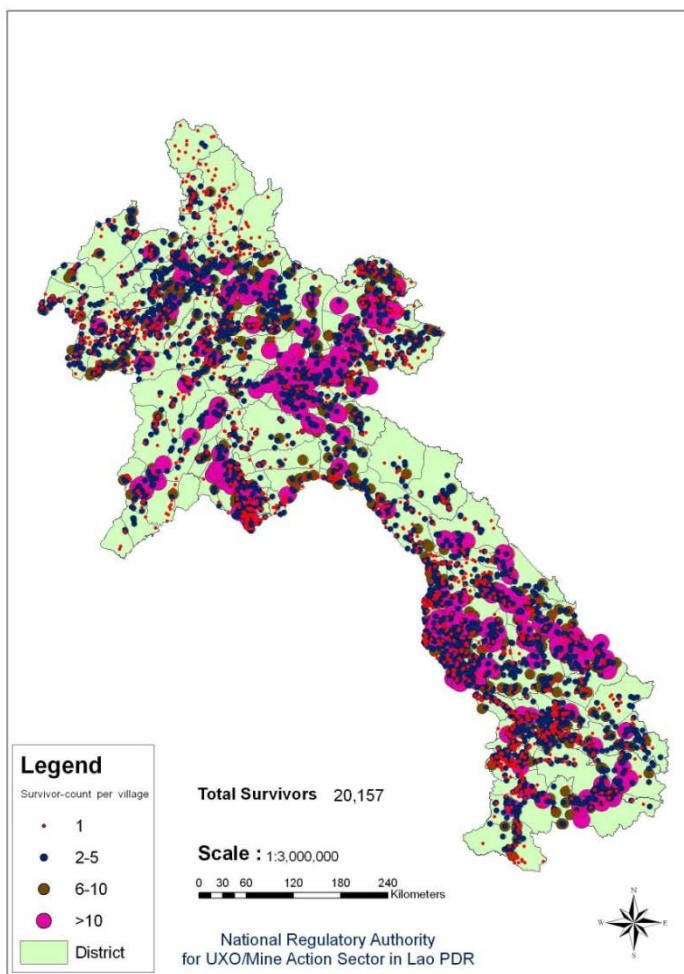

Victim and Accident Survey Phase 1

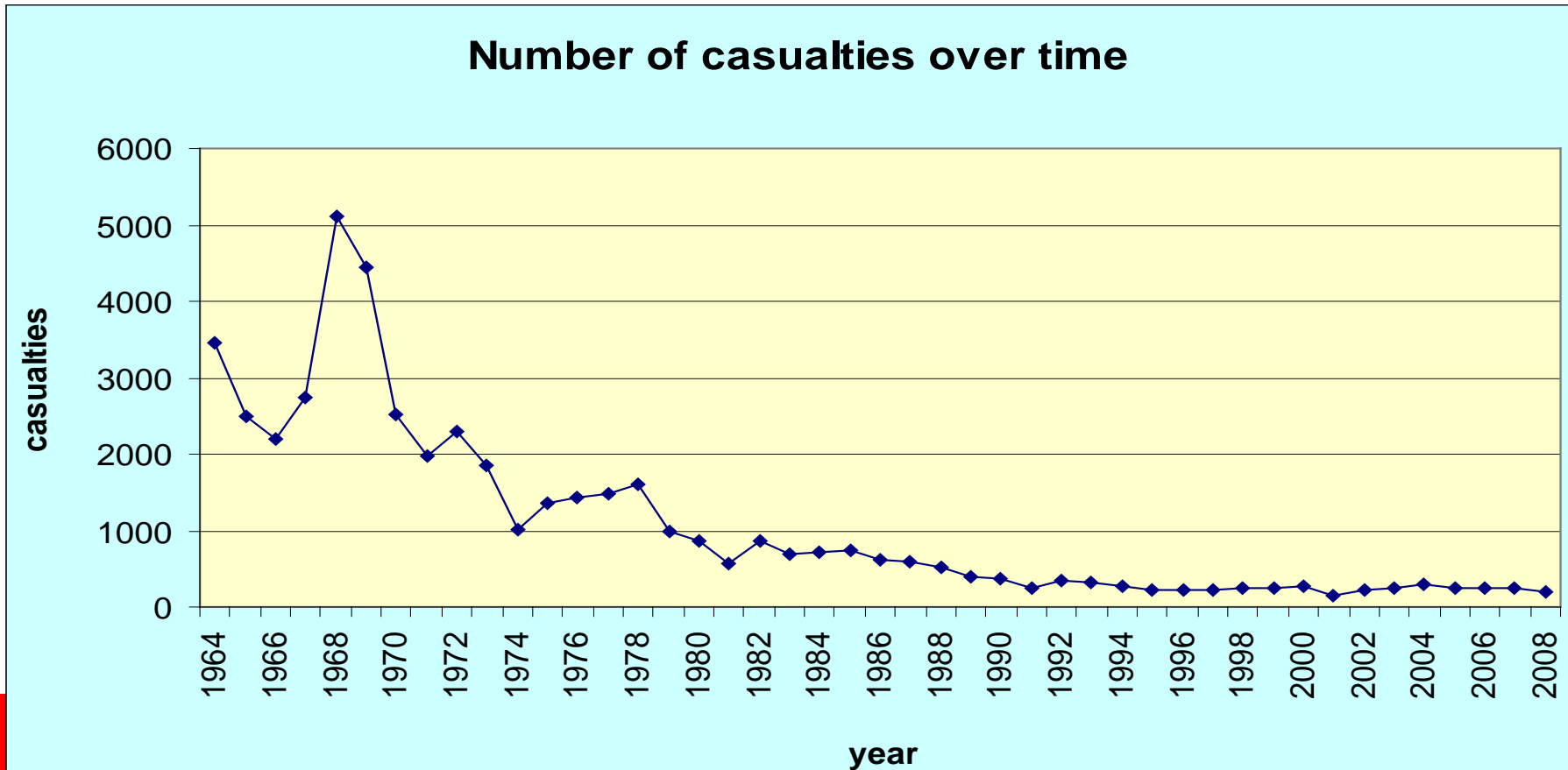


- 50,136 UXO casualties recorded (1964-2008)
- 12,500 casualties in Savannakhet Province
- 6,000 casualties in Xieng Khouang Province
- 59% killed – 41% injured

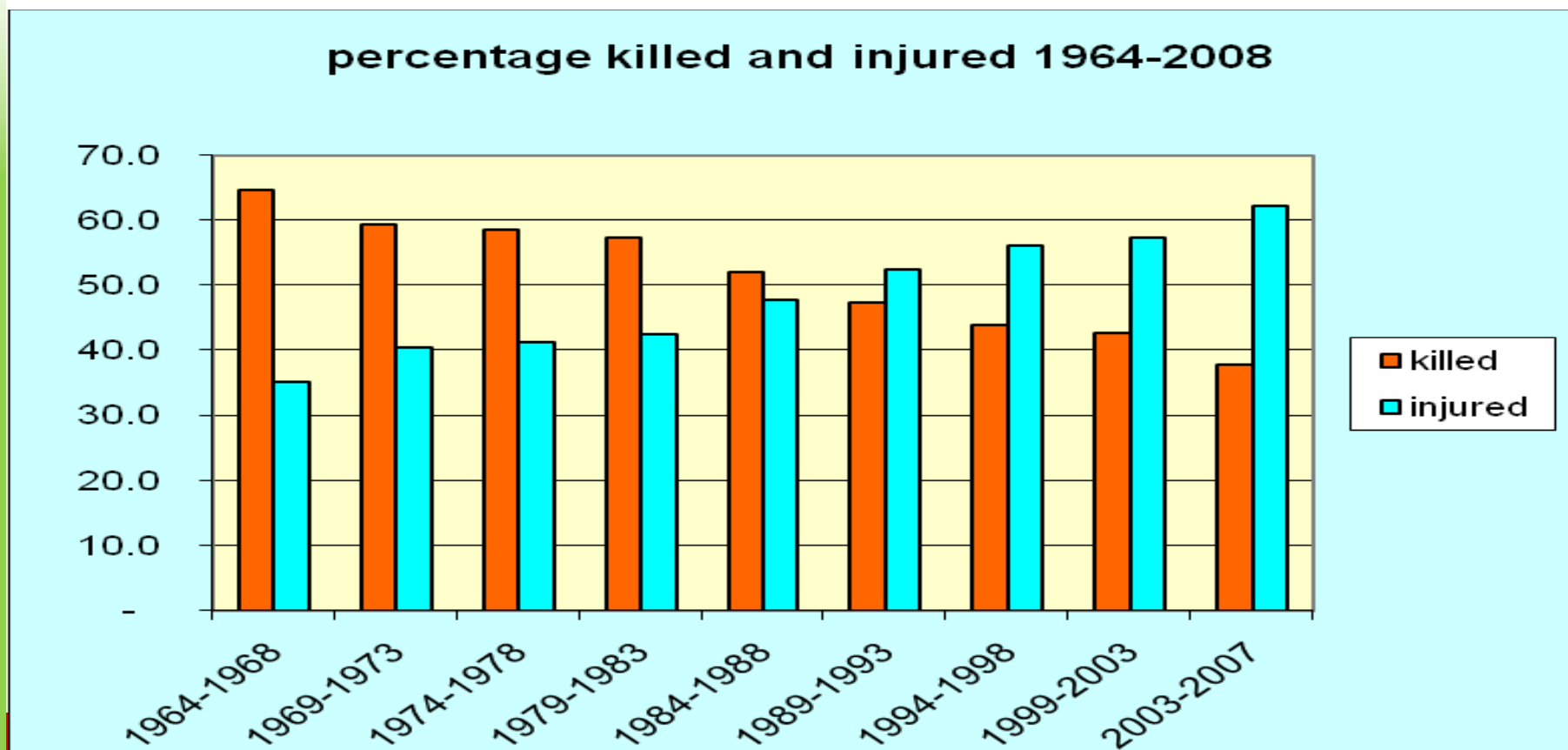
Results of Phase 1: Total Casualties 1964-2008

Revised Sector Strategy 2010-2020

The strategic goal of the Government and its development partners over the 2010 -2020 period is:

to reduce the humanitarian and socio-economic threats posed by UXO to the point where the residual contamination and challenges can be adequately addressed by a sustainable national capacity fully integrated into the regular institutional set-up of the Government.



Revised Sector Strategy 2010-2020

The new strategy comprises of **6 Strategic Objectives**

1. Reduce the number of UXO casualties from 300 to less than 75 per year
2. Ensure that the medical and rehabilitation needs of all UXO Survivors are met in line with treaty obligations
3. Release priority land and clear UXO in accordance with National Standards and treaty obligations
4. Ensure effective leadership, coordination and implementation of the national programme
5. Establish sustainable national capacity fully integrated into the regular set-up of the Government
6. Meet international treaty obligations



UXO Sector is:

- Well structured
- Increasing efficiency
- Well led nationally
- Proactive advocate of the Convention on Cluster Munitions
- Under resourced
- Need continued assistance
